

## Suggested Dimensions

Overall blank thickness: 11/4"

Shaft:  $1\frac{1}{4}$ " x  $1\frac{1}{16}$ " at throat to  $1\frac{1}{16}$ " x  $1\frac{1}{16}$ " at neck

Blade edges: 3/32"

Blade thickness: 3/8"

## Traditional beavertail

Blade length: 28" Blade width: 6½" Surface area: 148 sq.in.

This blade is an elegant classic design that seems to have its origin in native Maliseet and Passamaquoddy paddles. The blade area of 148 square inches makes it a comfortable paddle for short tours, and the broad tip gives reasonable impact resistance. The version I made for this book has a scalloped guide grip and balances perfectly, just above the throat, when dry.
